- All public parish Masses are suspended by direction of the Archbishop.
- A live and video recording of Sunday's Mass in English and Spanish will be available on our website starting this weekend.
- Mass intentions will be honored. Masses will continue to be celebrated privately by our priests.

- By order of the Archdiocese, all other parish activities and group meetings are suspended until further notice.
- Nativity's celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is postponed. A new date is not scheduled yet.
- First Reconciliation for Religious Education students is postponed.

Mass

Q. Will there be public Mass held at Nativity Catholic Church?

A. No, as of March 18, all public Masses are suspended as directed by the Archbishop.

Q. Do I have to attend Mass if I am sick/a caregiver/anxious to attend at this time?

A. "Those who are sick or are tending to the sick should not come to Mass this weekend. Those who because of anxiety, or are caregivers to the elderly or young children, may decide not to attend Mass. Given these extraordinary circumstances, I dispense the faithful of the Archdiocese of Miami from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass."

Q. Where can I watch a broadcasting of Mass at home?

A. Nativity Catholic Church will have live and recorded Sunday Masses in both English and Spanish available on their website beginning March 22, 2020. EWTN broadcasts daily Mass and Sunday Mass. Check with your cable provider for tv channel information.

Q. How can I make my donation if I am not at Mass?

Q. Will Mass Intentions be said during Mass, if Mass is not public?

A. Mass Intentions will be said at their scheduled Mass, public or private.
