Details you need to know about Baptisms at Nativity Catholic Parish

Registering for a Baptism at Nativity

• Read the pages and submit all documents to the Parish Office by mail or e-mail (preferred) at <u>office@nativityhollywood.org</u>.

Baptisms Days and Times

- Baptisms are held in the church on Sundays after the 12:30 Spanish mass. Tell family and friends to arrive no later than 1:30pm for the baptism, if they are not attending the 12:30pm mass. You should enter the church quietly and respectfully.
- Individual baptisms will not be held unless otherwise agreed upon.
- To schedule a baptism date, all paperwork and donation must be submitted prior to baptism date. (See checklist on page 3)
- English Group baptisms are held the 1st Sunday of the month.
- Spanish Group baptisms are held on the 3rd Sunday of the month.

Baptism Fee/Donation

- A donation for group baptisms of \$100 per child would be appreciated.
- Private baptisms will require a payment prior to the baptism date of \$350.

Clothing Requirements and Candle

- All children should be dressed in <u>white clothing</u>. Ivory and other shades of white are accepted.
 We do not give a white garment at the baptism due to the age range of children.
- Parents, godparents, family and friends should be dressed in church appropriate clothing.
- A candle is given to you at the baptism.

Baptizing A Child Over The Age Of 6

 Children over the age of 6 years old are at an "age of reason" and are aware of what is happening. Therefore, the Archdiocese requires children over the age of 6 years old to attend Religious Education Classes in preparation to receive their First Holy Communion.

Parent Requirements

- <u>As parents, baptizing your child holds great responsibility.</u> Since your child is too young to know what is happening, you promise to help your child grow each day as faithful followers of Jesus Christ and members of the Church. Please remember your promise by attending Sunday Mass weekly with your child and enrolling your child in Religious Education Classes when they enter school.
- At least one parent should be a practicing member of Nativity parish for <u>at least three months</u>. To register in the parish please visit our website, nativityhollywood.org and click on "Parish Registration."
- The baptismal registration form can be submitted by e-mail to office@nativityhollywood.org
- Parents must attend a baptism class.
- A copy of the child's birth certificate is needed. If your child was born in Broward County, call or go to the Broward County Health Dept., Vital Statistics Office, 2421-A S.W. 6th Avenue, Ft. Lauderdale, FL (on State Road 84, one mile East of I-95 on the South side of State Road 84 & 6th Avenue.) Phone (954) 467-4413.
- If one parent is not Catholic, we require a brief notarized letter from the parent stating that he/she permits the child to be baptized Catholic at Nativity Catholic Parish.
- If you are divorced or not married and one parent is not participating in the baptism, we require a copy of the document of sole custody or a notarized letter stating the parent permits the child to be baptized Catholic.
- If the child is adopted, we require a copy of adoption papers.
- If you are from another parish, we must have written permission from your parish for your child to be baptized at Nativity Catholic Parish.

Godparent Requirements

• A Godparent should be a person you feel will help your child grow in the Catholic faith, be a model of Christian living, and be an active member of the Catholic Church.

It Is For This Reason That The Church Asks The Following Of A Godparent:

- The godparent must be a Catholic in good standing, which means a baptized Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Communion and Confirmation, attends mass regularly, if married, is married in the Catholic Church, if single is not living with someone outside marriage.
- The godparent must be <u>16 years or older</u>.
- A Sponsor Certificate is required. For your convenience, it is found in this packet. A sponsor certificate is a letter/ certificate from a parish that must be signed by the pastor where the godparent registered and attends. This letter/certificate states that the godparent is a Catholic in good standing.
 - One godparent is required. Two godparents are strongly recommended.
 - One <u>Confirmed</u> Catholic is required. Two Confirmed Catholics are recommended.
 - If there are two godparents, one must be male and one female.
 - Non-Catholics may not serve as Catholic godparents, as they cannot be good role-models of Catholic living.
 - A Catholic who has not received all three sacraments of initiation <u>cannot</u> be a godparent.
- Someone married outside the Church is not able to receive Communion and is not able to be a sponsor.
- Also, a Catholic who has abandoned the Church is not able to be a proper sponsor of a new member into the Church.
- Parents are not allowed to be sponsors. Sponsors are to support the parents in their obligation as Christian parents.
- We strongly recommend the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) also known as Order of Christian Initiation for Adults program for our Catholic friends and families who were never baptized at a younger age. Classes begin in September. Please contact the rectory for more information.
- If the Godparent is unable to attend due to distance or unforeseen circumstances, another person may stand in as a proxy. The proxy must meet the same requirements as the godparent.

Christian Witness — (A baptized non-Catholic Christian)

- Provided there is one valid Catholic sponsor, a baptized non-Catholic Christian may serve as a Christian witness
 for Baptism only. This person is a Christian witness and not a sponsor and will not be registered as such.
- • Requirements to be a Christian Witness:
- at least sixteen years old
- a validly baptized Christian
- living an upright life
 - cannot be either parent
 - cannot be a Catholic who has abandoned their faith
- A Christian witness may never be a non-Christian i.e. Jewish or Muslim
- The notation "Christian witness" is placed under the name of the non-Catholic Christian witness in the baptismal register.

Baptism Class Information

- Parents and godparents are required to take a baptism preparation class.
- The Baptism Classes are bilingual and will be held in the CHURCH OFFICE BUILDING at 10 a.m on the 2nd Saturday of the month. The class is taught by a deacon. Do not bring documents to class. All documents should be submitted directly to the Church Office by e-mail.
- You may attend a baptism class at another Catholic parish. You must submit a document from that church stating you attended the baptism class there.
- If you have taken the class within the last 5 years, you do not need to take it again but must provide proof of attending.
